


Connecting the Transformer

- Unplug when notinuse.







Lubricating the Engine


Priming the Smoke Unit


Checking the Battery


Remote Control


The remote and lock-on a redesigned for use with moderate power supplies such as the one included with this set. It is compatible with virtually anymanufacturer's engines.


Operation Buttons

Throttle Up Throttle up the power to your trackbypressingthetopendoftheThrottle Control Rocker Switch firmly for about 5 seconds, until theengine's headlight and lighted cars burn bright. Thenputtheengineintomotionbyfirmlypressingthe Directionbutton(holditforapproximately1second)on your remote once. If the engine does not begin to move as soon as you firmly press the Direction button, you may not have sent enough voltage to the track to make the trainmove. Press the throttle up for a few more seconds until the train begins to move. To increase or decrease track voltage, and therefore train speed, press the throttle control rockers witch. Pressing the topendof the throttle will increase voltage and speed. Pressing the bottomendofthethrottle will decrease voltage and speed. The engine will maintain the speedyous etafter your elease the throttle untilyoup ressitagaint och angethe voltage and speed.

Bell - To sound the bell, firmly press and release the Bell button. To turn the belloff, press and release the Bell button again. The bell will continue to ring from the time youturniton until you press and release the button again to turn it off.


Emergency Stop Press the Emergency Stopbuttonandall trains onthetrack controlled by the remote will stopuntilyou reapply voltage. This is aneasy way to shut downyourtrainsat the endofasessionortostop suddenlythetrain'spath becomes obstructed.

CAUTION: Do not mix old and new batteries. Donotmix alkaline, standard(carbon-zinc), or rechargeable(nickel-cadnium) batteries.




Horn/Whistle - To soundthe whistle, firmly pressthe Horn/Whistle button. The whistle will soundforaslongasyou continue to depressthebutton. It will stop when you release the button.

Direction Your train is programmedtostartinneutral. The train will alwayscycle neutral-forward-neutral-reverse with each press and release of the directionbutton. The engine is programmedtorestartinneutral each time the track voltage is turned off for 25seconds or more.



Manual Volume Control

Toadjustthevolumeofallsoundsmade bythisengine, turnthemastervolume control knob located under the tender clockwise to increase the volume and counter-clockwise to decrease the volume.



Proto-Sound 2.0 Operating Instructions

This manual contains the operating instructions for Proto-Sound2.0inconventional mode only. InstructionsforaccessingDCS command mode features accompany the DCS Remote Control System equipment.

Activating Proto-Sound2.0Conventional Mode Features:

Proto-Sound2.0features are activated by sequences of Bell and Whistle button pushes described below. Please read the full descriptions of each feature before using it. To use these buttons to activate features rather than to blow the whist learning the bell, you should tap the buttons very quickly with a ½-second pause between button presses. You may need to practice your timing to make this works moothly.



Passenger station announcements (PSA):

Your engine is equipped with a soundpackage of passenger station announcements that you can play when you pullintoastation. Each sequence described below willplay as long asitislefton, randomly generating sounds, but be sure to allow approximately 30 seconds between the button pushes described below to allow the PSA sufficient time torunthrough each sequence.

- To cuethesound systemtoplaythePSA,quicklybutfirmlytap the Bell button once followed by2quicktapsoftheWhistlebuttonwhiletheengineismoving. Tap the buttons quicklybutallowapproximately½ second between each press.
- Press the Direction buttononcetostoptheengine. This will trigger the first sequence of PSA. Thereverseunitistemporarily disabled so that the train will not move as you usethe Direction button to trigger the sounds, and Proto-Sound 2.0 has disabled operator control over the Whistleand Bell button suntil the full PSA sequence is complete.
- After waiting about 30secondsforthatsequencetorun, press the Direction button again to trigger the second sequence of PSA.
- After about 30seconds, pressthe Direction button again to trigger the third PSA sequence.

 Again, after allowing about 30seconds for that sequencetorun, presstheDirection button one more time to trigger thefourthandfinalPSA sequence. The PSA will continue, and within a few seconds, the engine and bell will start and move out on its own at the current throttle setting, in the same direction it was traveling when you began the sequence. Once the bell turns off, the operator regains control of the transformer's bell and Whistle buttons and can ring the bell or blow the Whistle as usual.



Tips on Using PSA

- YoucanterminatePSAatanytimebyturningoffpowertothetrackfor15 seconds.
- Youdonothavetobe in Forward to use PSA. Attheconclusionofthefull sequence, thetrainwillpullaway from the station in whateverdirection you were going when youactivated thefeature.
- YoucanusePSAevenifyouaredouble-heading withanotherengine. If the secondengine is not equipped with Proto-Sound 2.0, you must remember not to leave the throttle at a high voltage level once you have stopped the engine to runthe PSA. Otherwise, the engine without PSA will be ginvibrating on the track as its motors strain to move the train, since they cannot be automatically disabled during the PSA cycle (or if a nor iginal Proto-Sound engine, PSA are triggered differently and that engine 's motor-disable feature will not be active when you run PSA in Proto-Sound 2.0).
- PSAcanbetriggeredfromNeutral. It will operate the same as if triggered
 while in motion except that, at the conclusion of the PSA, the engine will
 depart in the next direction of travel, as opposed to the direction it was
 traveling before entering Neutral.

Proto-Coupler® Operation

This locomotive is equipped with one or more coil-wound Proto-Couplers forremote uncoupling action. Because Proto-Couplers are controlled through the Proto-Sound 2.0 microprocessor, they do not require a nuncoupling track section or modification to your layout to function. You can fire a coupler from neutralor while in motion. Use the code shown below (and in the charton p.8) to fire the coupler (s).

Rear Coupler:

To fire the rear coupler, quickly tap the Bellbutton once followed by three quick taps of the Whistle button, allowing approximately ½ second to lapse between each quick button press. The sound of the lift bar and air line depletion will play, and the knuckle will be released.









Fire Rear Coupler

Front Coupler:

To fire the front coupler (if your engine has one), quickly tap the Bell button once followedbyfourquicktapsoftheWhistlebutton, allowing approximately ½ second to lapse between each quick button press. The sound of the lift barandair line depletion will play, and the knuckle will be released.













Speed Control:

M.T.H. engines equipped with Proto-Sound 2.0 have speedcontrol capabilities that allow the engine to maintain a constant speedup and downgrades and around curves, much like an automobile cruise control. You can addord rope arson the run, and the engine will maintain the speed you set.

While the engine is programmed to start with the speed control feature activated, you can opt to turn it off. This means the engine's speed will fall as it labors up a hill and increase as it ravels downward. It is also affected by the addition or releasing of cars while on the run. Because the engine will run more slowly at a given throttle voltage when speed control is on than when it is off, you should adjust the throttle to a lower power level for operation with speed control off to avoid high-speed derailments. When speed control is off, the volume will drop to allow for better low voltage operation.

To turn speedcontrol on andoff, put the engine in neutral, then quickly tap the transformer's Whistle button one time then quickly tap the Bellbutton two times, allowing approximately ½ second to lapse between each quick button press. Two horn blasts will indicate that the engine has made the change. Repeat the 1 whistle, 2 bells code to return it to the other condition. You will want to do this during the initial neutral upon start-up if you ever couple this engine to another engine that is not equipped with speed control to avoid damaging the motor sine itherengine. Each time you shut down the engine completely, it will automatically turn speed control on.

LockintoaDirection:

You can lock your engineintoadirection(forward, neutral, orreverse) sothatitwillnot change directions. To do this, put the engineintothedirectionyouwant(orintoneutral to lock itintoneutral), run it at a very slow crawl (as slowly as it will move without halting), andquicklybutfirmlytaptheWhistlebuttononcefollowedbythreequicktaps oftheBellbutton, allowing approximately½ second to lapse between each quick button press. Two whistle blasts willindicate that the engine has made the change. The engine will not change direction (including goin ginto neutral) until your epeat the 1 whistle, 3 bells code to return the engine to its normal condition, even if the engine is kept without power for extended periods of time.

Tooverridethesettingsyoucurrentlyhaveassignedtotheengineandresetittoits factory defaults, while in Neutral tap the Whistle buttonquicklyonce,followed by five quicktapsoftheBellbutton,allowingapproximately½secondtolapsebetweeneach quickbuttonpress. Two whistle blasts willindicatethattheenginehasmadethechange.



Automatic Sounds:

 $Certain\ Proto-Sound 2.0 sound effects automatically play in programmed conventional mode conditions:$

- **Squealing Brakes** play any time the engine's speeddecreases rapidly.
- Cab Chatter plays at random intervals when the engine idles inneutral.
- Engine Start-up and Shut-down sounds play when the engine is initially powered on or is powered off for five seconds or more.

Maintenance

Care of the Remote Control

Your RailKing Remote Control System shouldofferyearsoftrouble-freeservice. There are a fewthingsyoucandotoensuretrouble-freeoperation:


- If your train responds inconsistently, replace oldbatteries with freshones. Do not mix old and new batteries.
- Remove batteries before storing for extended periods.
- Donotdroptheremote. It can damage the delicateelectronics inside.
- Any attempt by anyone other than an authorized M.T.H. repair person to open and repair the handheld transmitter or lock-on may result in damage and the loss of warranty protection.

Lubrication Instructions


The engine shouldbeoiledandgreasedinordertorunproperly.

Regularly lubricate all side rods and linkage components and pickup rollers toprevent squeaking. Use light household oil, such asthatfoundinM.T.H.'s maintenance kit. Do not over oil. Use only a droportwooneachpivot point.












Greasing Instructions

The locomotive's internal gearing was greased at the factory. Grease engine every 50 hours of use or one year. Use a lithium based grease and follow the greasing instructions.



- Remove thescrewfromthechassistoopen thegreaseport.
- Insertthegreasetubetipintotheportand squeezethetubeonceortwicetoaddgrease tothegearbox.
- Wipeoffanyexcessgreaseandreplacethe phillipsscrewsecurely.

Cleaning the Wheels, Tires and Track

Periodically checkthelocomotive wheels and pickups for dirt and buildup, which can cause poor electrical contact and traction and prematurely wear out the neoprenetraction tires. Wheels and tires can be cleaned using denatured (not rubbing) alcohol applied with a cotton swab.


Tocleanthetrack, use RailKing Track Cleaning Fluid and a clean rag or denatured (notrubbing) alcohol. Unplug the transformer and wipe the rails of the track, turning the rag frequently to ensure that you are using clean clothon the rails. Because the manufacturing




process leaves a coatingonRealTrax center rail, you should clean the rails after the first 30 minutes of use (you may notice an electrical smell during initial use as the coating wears off; this is normal). Thereafter, keep an eye on the track and clean it when it gets dirty to ensure good electrical contact and to lengthen the life of the tires.

Traction Tire Replacement Instructions

Yourlocomotive is equipped with two neoprenerubbert raction tires on the rear set of flanged drivers. While these tires are extremely durable, you may need to replace them at some point.



- Removethesiderods(therodsthatconnecteachdrivewheeltotheother)from thewheelsinordertoslipthenewtireoverthegrooveddrivewheel. Thesebolts canbeloosenedwitha5mmnutdriver.
- Cleanthegrooveusingacottonswabanddenaturedalcohol.



- Makesuretheoldtirehasbeencompletelyremovedfromthegrooveinthedrive wheel,usingarazorbladeorsmallflatheadscrewdrivertopryawayanyremains.
- Cleanthegrooveusingacottonswabanddenaturedalcohol.
- Slipthenewtireontothewheel. Youmayfinditusefultousetwosmallflathead screwdriverstostretchthetireoverthewheel.
- Ifyoutwistthetirewhilestretchingitoverthewheel, youwillneedtoremoveand reinstall thetire. Otherwiseyourenginewillwobblewhileoperating.
- Makesurethetireisfullyseatedinsidethegroove. Usearazorbladetotrimaway anyexcesstirethatdoesn'tseatitselfinsidethegrooveproperly.

ProtoSmoke® Unit Operation

This steamlocomotivecontains a smoke unit that outputs smoke through the smokestack ontheboileroftheengine. The smoke unitisessentially asmallheating element and wick that soaks up and then heat samineral oil-based fluid that emits a harmless smoke. The smoke is then forced out of the stack by a small electric fan.

Withafeweasymaintenancesteps, youshouldenjoytrouble-free smoke unit operation for years.


 When preparing to runthis engine, add 15-20 drops of smokefluid through the smokestack. We recommend M.T.H.Proto Smoke, Seuthe, LGB, or LVTS fluids (a small pipette of Proto Smoke fluid is included). Do not overfill the unit or the fluid may leak out and coat the interior engine components. If youchoosenottoaddthefluid(orhavealready added the fluid but choose torunsmoke-free),turnoff the smoke unit switch located undertheenginebody.
 Failure eithertoadd fluid to the unit or to turn it off may damagethesmokeunitheatingelement and/or wicking material.

Running the engine without a primed smoke unit may cause damage

- When the smoke output while running the engine begins todiminish,addanother 10-15 drops of smoke fluidorturnthesmokeunitoff.
- When storing the unit for long periods of time, you may want to add about 15dropsoffluidtoprevent the wick fromdryingout.
- Afterremovingtheenginefromstorage, add another 25dropsoffluid, letting the wicksoak up the fluid for 15 minutes priortooperation.

If you experience poor or nosmokeoutput when the smoke unitisonandhasfluid, checkthewicktosee if it has become hard, blackened, and unabsorbent around the heatingelement. Remove the boiler as shown below. Remove thesmokeunitinspectioncoverfromthe locomotive's body (see right). After removing the chassis and inspection cover screws, lift theinspectionplateaway and inspect the wick. If it is darkly discolored andhard, it should be replaced. When priming new wick add 40 drops

Self-Charging Battery Back-Up

The special NiCad7-cell8.4vself-chargingbatteryrecharges continuously duringtrain operation and should last for upto fiveyears. The battery is a drybatterythat should not leak or cause any damage to your engine. **Depending upon when your engine was built, it may need to be charged rightout of the box.** If engines ounds seem distorted or garbled at low voltages or becomes ilent when power from the transformer is turned off, test the battery to determine whether it should be recharged or replaced.


- **Test:** Put theengineinneutralandleavethetrackvoltageat10-12volts(high enough for the lights toshinebrightlyand the engine to movesteadily) for 15 minutes.
- Recharge: If the sounds are improved at the end of the 15-minute test charge, the battery charge has rundown and can be recharged. There are a number of ways you candothis:
 - Leave the engine in neutral with track voltage at 10-12 volts for 6-7 hours so the battery can fully recharge (if your engine has a smoke unit, be sure it is turned of f).

 Use M.T.H.'s batteryrecharger (sold separately) thatplugs into a wall outlet and a special port under the tendertorechargethebatteryovernight withoutleaving

it onthetrack.



Replace: If the sounds are not improved at the end of the 15-minute test charge, it is
time to replace the battery. Available through M.T.H. Parts. A standard 9 valkaline
battery can be substituted until your replacement arrives, but since alkaline batteries
cannot be recharged, it will eventually wear down. Do NOTusea 6-cell 7.2 v
battery.

Troubleshooting Proto-Sound® 2.0 Problems

Although Proto-Sound 2.0hasbeendesignedandengineeredforeaseofuse, youmay have some questions during initial operation. The following table should answer most questions. 


